### Methodology

<u>Class 1</u>

 Active learning to stimulate reflection and group discussion on different topics with supervision and support of the teacher.

Class 2

- The classes will be expositive, with practical exercises and discussion of topics.

#### Assessment

Class 1

- 2 creative projects (group work process and presentation) 70%
- Individual participation 30%

#### Class 2

- Exercises and mini-tests (continuous assessment with exercises and mini-tests for progression evaluation), with a final global test – 70%
- Participation 30%

Assessment criteria for individual or group work – clarity, precision, relevance, depth, breadth, adequacy and accuracy.

Evaluation criteria of participation – relevance and frequency of individual participation, contribution to the quality of learning of the group/class; capacity for self-evaluation.

#### Attendance

Students are required to attend all classes. Students are allowed to miss a maximum of 3 classes (in 10).
